## Rector's Reflection The Easter Journey

The Risen Jesus appeared five times after the Sunday of the Resurrection; one week later in Jerusalem; forty days later just outside of Jerusalem at Bethany for The Ascension; and three times in between, including twice in Galilee, over 100 miles north of Jerusalem. The disciples were busy trying to figure out what comes next? At one point they even went back to fishing in Galilee.

Right before the Ascension, Jesus tells the disciples to stay in Jerusalem where they will receive new power from the Holy Spirit and, then, they will be Jesus' witnesses "to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:1-8) The journey that begins on Easter Day, continues after the Ascension and Pentecost "to the ends of the earth."

You and I are part of this continuing Easter journey. We are "witnesses" here in Alexandria and Northern Virginia. Some of us travel far. Our Journey to Adulthood class will go to Ireland and Iceland, as they continue their Easter journey this summer.

So, too, we will welcome our new Associate Rector, The Rev. Jason Roberson, this summer. Father Jason "journeyed" with us as our seminarian while at Virginia Theological Seminary. Now he returns as a Priest to help lead and pastor our parish.

As we move into the month of May, we'll be well into Phase Two of our HVAC construction project. Phase Three begins after school is out in June.

Following the Risen Lord keeps us on the move. There is no sitting still. The world needs our witness, our message. Our parish is like a great ship travelling through the seas of life in every age.

Some days are calm, tranquil, filled with beauty. Some days are filled with storms and darkness. The journey continues and we know Jesus' promise, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

## New Associate Rector Called

The Rev. Jason Roberson is a 2017 graduate of Virginia Theological Seminary, where he served as seminarian here at Grace from 2015-17. After graduation he was ordained in his home diocese, the Episcopal Church in South Carolina, and he has served for the past two years as Assistant Rector at Holy Cross Faith Memorial Episcopal Church, in Pawleys Island, SC. Before attending seminary, Father Jason taught Spanish language and linguistics courses at several universities, and he also worked as a medical and court interpreter. He is currently a board member of the Dominican Development Group, and he has organized and led several mission trips to the Dominican Republic with the Dominican Episcopal Church.

Father Jason will be primarily responsible for our liturgies in Spanish with La Gracia but will also be greatly involved across all ministries at Grace, including our liturgies in English and pastoral care. He is delighted to be returning to Grace, to reestablish old friendships, to make new ones, and to partner in ministry with all of us here. His first Sunday will be July 7.



The Boys and Girls choir will lead us in Choral Evensong on June 2 at 5:00 p.m. The canticles are *Magnificat and Nunc dimittis in D Major* by English organist Herbert Sumsion and John Ireland's *Ex ore innocentium*. The choir has been working on two part harmony this year and these pieces will highlight their ever increasing talent. Following the closing voluntary, the Holy Eucharist Rite I will be celebrated.

## Grace Legacy Society

Anamnesis is a word and concept introduced to me by The Rev. Charles P. Price. Dr. Price served as Professor of Systematic Theology at Virginia Theological Seminary and previously as Principal Preacher at Harvard University's chapel. He was an integral contributor to the 1979 Book of Common Prayer and the 1982 Hymnal.

Dr. Price taught that anamnesis is a liturgical term used by the Church to refer to the memorial character of the Eucharist, Passion, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus. This concept of anamnesis is based on the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me".

Our Christian faith is based on this remembering of the past, living in the present, and having hope for the future. As we remember Jesus' mission of salvation, we seek to live as his disciples in the here and now, and to make provision for the remembering to continue to future generations. Participation in the Grace Legacy Society is a means of remembering God's love in the past and ensuring that it lives into the future.

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## Flower Delivery Ministry

## Teaching and Learning

Last month I promised that I would write about worship in places we DO call “church.” Since that’s a pretty broad topic, let’s examine one aspect of it: teaching and learning.

Since the Israelites’ exodus out of Egypt, teaching and learning has been an integral part of our faith. We aren’t taught to worship God blindly and unthinkingly; instead, we are encouraged to listen, question and learn. God taught Moses what to say to the people (Exodus 4:12) and Moses, in turn, taught others to teach the “statutes and ordinances” by which they would live (Deuteronomy 4:1). I imagine that they shared stories as well. In fact, the Hebrew word *rabbi* means “teacher.”

Jesus was called “teacher” by his own disciples and is recognized as a great teacher by other religious faiths as well. He taught “as one who had authority,” even when he was a youth in the temple (Mark 1:22). He taught through parables; he shocked people into paying attention; he asked questions; he employed visual illustrations and repetition; and he crafted memorable sayings such as, “Judge not, and you will not be judged” (Luke 6:37). To the degree that it was possible for any human being, he wanted his disciples to understand the nature of God the Father. His reason became clear when, after his resurrection, he gave his [disciples](#) the “Great Commission” to spread [his teachings](#) to all the [nations](#) of the world (Matthew 28:16-20).

The apostle Paul emphasized the importance of teaching as part of worship: “When you come together, each one has a hymn, a lesson, a revelation, a tongue, or an interpretation. Let all things be done for building up” (1 Corinthians 14:26). When the earliest Christians came together, “they devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers” (Acts 2:42).



As small and intimate gatherings evolved into “churches” with large congregations, teaching methods evolved as well. For the first 1600 years of Christianity, most people couldn’t read or write. Every stained-glass window, carving and statue in medieval churches told a story. They were not only beautiful to look at, but they were also very functional. Some windows and

carvings told a Bible story and the priest could point to them during his homilies. A father and mother could point to the statue of a saint and pass the saint’s story along to their children. Statues, carvings and stained glass were, for them, more than art; they were teaching tools.

Let’s fast-forward to modern times. Our Holy Eucharist worship service has two parts: the Word of God and the Holy Communion. The first part is all about teaching and learning. It always includes a Gospel reading and either an Old Testament or New Testament Lesson. (Get it? “Lesson.”) Our non-eucharistic Daily Offices also have two parts: Lessons and Prayers. So, the beginning of any Episcopal liturgy is centered on hearing the Word of God read directly, and then hearing a sermon or homily

that is based upon what was read. Teaching and learning.

Each week we have the opportunity to grow in our knowledge of our Creator, who made us and invited us to learn about Him. We can, through teaching and learning, directly express our admiration for God. I believe that learning

itself is a spiritual act—an act of worship. It draws us closer to God. Furthermore, it teaches us to become a blessing to those around us; to be a wellspring of love, peace, and truth; and to spread the kingdom and its justice in the world, preparing the way for what is surely to come.

### My Remembrances of Grace Church



I was born in March of 1925 around the corner from Grace Episcopal Church on Patrick Street where my entire family, parents, foster parents and grandparents attended church.

I was baptized there in May of 1925. As I got older, I attended Sunday School, Junior Auxiliary and participated and enjoyed several other activities for children my age.

As I got older and started attending church with my family, it was instilled in me that the Church was a very special place; a place of love, reverence and to learn the love of God. I knew that when we entered those Church doors on Patrick Street each Sunday morning, it was a place for praying, quietness and listening.

I have a lot of pleasant memories and some not so pleasant from Old Grace Church. After spending a short time there, at the age of 8 or 9, we moved from the church and the area.

I thank God every day for bringing me back to the new Grace Church. When we moved back to the area, we lived at Presidential Gardens, just down the street from the existing location.

When we found out the church was moving to the Russell Road site, we felt as if it was now in our backyard.

We returned to the new Grace church in 1949. As soon as I entered the first time, we knew that we were home and I continue to have that feeling each time I walk through the doors of the Church.

In Grace Church, old and new, we have something that we never felt in any other church we had attended; peace, love, caring, friendliness, compassion and the love of God.

As my daughter told Father Malm during the sesquicentennial celebration: "We have so many memories in these stones from the last sixty-five years." Our three children were baptized, confirmed and our two daughters were married in this church.

I no longer live around the corner and the Church is not in my backyard, but I still get here regularly with assistance from my friends and family and I hope to always be able to walk through those doors.

I love everything about Grace Church. It has been a big part of my life and it always will.
